1) Executive Summary

Membership in Central Alberta Branch continues to grow in accordance with expansion of the local economy. There are now approximately 750 members in the Branch. The Branch Executive ranks have also grown; there are now 16 executive members.

It is always a challenge to increase participation in Branch events. In the past year regular Branch activities have been augmented with two additional offerings on the monthly calendar i.e. Lunchtime Forum & New Members' Network. This has allowed different members of the Branch to join in Branch activities. As well, comments and suggestions for improvement have been solicited from members through a feedback survey distributed at Branch events.

In February 2004, APEGGA Executive Committee requested that the Branch Chairs encourage policy discussions at the Branch level. To facilitate these discussions a regular policy agenda item has been added to Branch Executive meetings. Executive members have also been asked to be more proactive in soliciting opinions and more attentive to the policy issues coming from members.

Another challenge facing the Branch is to provide events and activities for those Branch members not residing or working in the Red Deer area. While the vast majority of Branch members are concentrated in or around Red Deer there are many members who reside in other towns and cities or rural areas of Central Alberta. The Branch will ensure that these members are given ample opportunities to participate in Branch events. This can be achieved simply by planning events for these locales. The contributions and perspectives of all members must be considered in the business of the Branch.

The Central Alberta Branch has planned a number of activities for the next 18 months (July 2004 – December 2005) to support each of the following goals:

- 1. To promote science & technology in local schools
- 2. To improve the public image of APEGGA and its member professions
- 3. To provide mentoring resources and services to M.I.T.s
- **4.** To provide networking opportunities for members
- **5.** To provide for professional development needs of the members
- 6. To provide a two way forum for communication between the membership and Council
- 7. To enhance the value and relevance of APEGGA to the members
- 8. To increase member involvement in Branch activities and issues

An ambitious undertaking by the Branch has commenced to coincide with Alberta's Centennial celebrations in 2005. This Legacy Project will provide for a significant and permanent artistic display commemorating the contributions of APEGGA members, especially those of Central Alberta, to Alberta's past century of prosperity. Funding will be solicited from APEGGA Head Office. If necessary, funding can be augmented by corporate contributions from local businesses and by voluntary donations from Branch members. It is hoped that a Gala Dinner & Dance will be held in September 2005 to celebrate the Centennial and the public unveiling of the display.

In 2004 - 2005 Central Alberta Branch will build upon past successes in order to become more effective and to provide more opportunities for member participation with increased visibility to members and the public.
