Back by popular demand, UIC is organizing a tour of its facilities for members of APEGGA, APEGS, ASET & SASTT.

Some details regarding the UIC facility:

- > Over 100,000 square feet of manufacturing space divided among 6 shops
- > 200+ employees
- ASME approved vessel shop specializing in oilfield equipment, with capacities for vessels up to 22 feet in diameter and over 100 feet long
- > Two tank shops on site with a combined capacity of over 100 tanks per month.
- Adjacent machine shop with 5 machinists and all equipment required for assembling CANMET® hydrocyclones
- > Central office facility with 30 Draftspersons, Technologists and Engineers

Some of the projects currently underway include:

- Steam Generators for Nexen Long Lake. Each of these units burn 250 MMBTU/hr of natural gas (roughly the equivalent to the entire city of Lloydminster in the middle of winter!) and are the largest units of their kind ever built.
- Flash Treater® for Deer Creek. This is a slop oil treater with Universal Industries' proprietary new recycle design utilizing a high efficiency burner system which is the first of its kind in the industry.
- > Various tanks for Husky, Devon, Baytex, Murphy Oil and others
