**BRANCH ACTIVITIES**

**Changes in Executive**

- Three members of the executive have resigned recently. Rick Granberg has moved to a new position in South Dakota. Andrew Wagner & Wade Keller have decided to resign their executive positions in order to concentrate on other volunteer activities including the 2005 Branch Legacy project.

**2005 Centennial Legacy Project**

- CAB Executive has approved a proposal from local firm, Voyager Art & Tile, to construct a “Busker Bubble” (sidewalk mosaic) and “Stratified Bench” on the 48<sup>th</sup> St. Promenade (Alexander Way) in downtown Red Deer. Voyager Art & Tile will be contracted by the Branch for design and production of the artistic installation.
- The project Steering Committee at the City of Red Deer has yet to provide approval of the design details. This should be forthcoming shortly.
- The City has provided further details regarding exact location and construction schedule.

**Events**

- The Branch has co-sponsored a series of lectures on Sustainability at Red Deer College. The first event, a public debate on the Kyoto Protocol with representatives from the Fraser and Parkland Institutes, was held on Tuesday, January 18. Approximately 170 people attended the event which was very well received despite the poor road conditions which precluded the participation of one of the debaters!
