

## What is the Peace Country Science Olympics?

Teams of students from grades 7-12 will get the chance to get up close and personal with the principles and theories of science at the **2004 Peace Country Science Olympics, Saturday, March 13** at Grande Prairie Composite High School.


Organized by the Association of Professional Engineers, Geologists and Geophysicists of Alberta (APEGGA), the Peace Country Science Olympics is an interactive science competition that allows students to see first-hand how science affects our everyday lives. This event is one of several activities being held province-wide in celebration of National Engineering & Geoscience Week (NEGW).

The Olympics consists of two types of events:

- a take-home event, which is made in advance and brought to the Olympics for on-site testing and judging; and
- two mystery events, which are solved the day of the Olympics with no pre-planning

All challenges are based on current science curricula and have been developed by the Edmonton Science

#### Awards

All participants receive a small keepsake and a certificate recognizing their participation in the **2004**Peace Country Science Olympics.

**Division III and IV** – Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded in each event. Second and Third place teams overall for Division III and Division IV will receive plaques. A trophy will be awarded for the top overall team in each Division. The trophy will be kept at the winning school for one year and is to be returned at the beginning of the next year's Science Olympics.

Prizes will also be awarded for team pennants.

Division III and IV participate in a halfday competition, taking part in two mystery events and one take-home event.

All teams will also construct and bring a team banner.


#### To Enter
