
Mentoring

As I mentioned in my last newsletter, I would write a little about APEGGA's Mentoring Program. In September, the APEGGA Council agreed to support a pilot mentoring program by committing \$10,000 to the project. If there is corporate support, the program will be available throughout the province within 12 to 15 months. The pilot is being developed in Calgary and APEGGA has hired a consultant to help in the development of the mentoring program. A complete set up package for all branches is envisioned as part of the successful launch of the program, and is something that the Peace River Branch is looking forward to!

The last two editions of *The PEGG* have had articles regarding mentoring. The first article talks about what skills are required to be a good mentee and listed the things that must be done to ensure a good mentoring relationship. The second article, which will be in the January edition of *The PEGG* identifies 38 activities that help lead mentees to positive results through preparation and implementation of the mentee/mentor relationship, reviewing accomplishments, and taking the next steps.
