## An Interesting Afternoon at the Lindbergh Salt Plant

12 members of the Vermilion River Branch traveled to Lindbergh, Alberta on October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2001 to tour the Windsor Salt Plant. The Salt Plant is responsible for producing approximately 425 tons/day of salt, including food salts, deicing salts, agriculture salts and water softening salts. Attendees were able to see the evaporation process, packaging process, and storage of the huge volumes of salt. Sloane Dieken and Jamie Gingrich of the Canadian Salt Company gave a great tour of the facility, and even included a free sample of the product.
