Local Student Honoured for Excellence in Education

Nanton – Nanton resident and University of Alberta student Joshua Dyck has been awarded a \$3,000 scholarship from the Education Foundation of The Association of Professional Engineers, Geologists and Geophysicists of Alberta (APEGGA).

Dyck is the recipient of the APEGGA MacEwan College Transfer Scholarship, awarded on the basis of academic achievement to students completing an engineering, geological or geophysical technology program who are continuing their studies in engineering, geology or geophysics at the University of Alberta or the University of Calgary.

In 2006, the APEGGA Education Foundation awarded 38 scholarships totaling \$103,000 to high school and post-secondary students from across Alberta who are pursuing a career in the professions of engineering, geology or geophysics.
